"Hello, I am looking for guidance and financial help as I get through a challenging time in my life. I have autism and was denied disability benefits and am looking for resources to help me get back on track."

"Hello, I am seeking help with food and utility bill payment. Single father, low income."

"Currently 9 months pregnant with 3 younger children and looking for family resources - diapers, clothing, baby equipment, etc."

"Hello OUR Center -I need help with getting emergency housing."

These are a few of the calls the OUR Center got in just one week. Hundreds more calls come in and many people walk through the front door looking for assistance. In fact, so far this year, we've assisted with:

- 5,798 OUR Center visits
- 16,654 Individuals served
- 385,347 pounds of groceries distributed
- 316 Utility shut-off preventions
- 316 Rent and shelter assistance



I need housing quickly because my spouse just passed away. I need to exit my current home by the end of the month. I also have a dog. Do you have any hotel vouchers or short-term vouchers while I settle my husband's affairs?"

Right now, we need your continued support as we navigate assistance through the summer months and into the fall.

Our most immediate need is to help provide rent and utilities to families who face unforeseen challenges. Facing higher costs for basic needs, and wages not keeping up with inflation, many low-income and even 'middle-income' families are strained. The OUR Center is often their last option before homelessness or making the difficult decision to leave the community they call home.

Our staff meet with each family individually, confidentially, and in-depth to determine their challenges and struggles and help them find solutions. Our resources and community partners help them discover their options. We provide opportunities for ongoing personal development once the family has stabilized.

Here's what your gift will help make possible

- \$1,000 can support a family with one month's rent assistance
- \$500 can help a family with utilities (gas, heat, electricity)
- \$250 can help us provide food pantry products
- \$100 can provide one month's worth of lunches in our Café

Thanks to people like you, the OUR Center provided over \$1.8 million in assistance in 2022 to our St. Vrain Valley families in need. We are on target to surpass that number this year. Many COVID-19 relief programs have gone away, but people's financial challenges have not.

Your past support has been critical to keeping families in their homes, keeping the heat and lights on, keeping families fed and clothed. Thank you for your additional support of \$2,500 during these trying times.
